## Uveitis in Horses: What to Look For and How to Help Prevent It

Uveitis, often called "moon blindness," is a painful eye condition that can affect horses. It causes inflammation inside the eye and, if not treated early, can lead to serious problems—even blindness. Sometimes the signs come and go, but repeated flare-ups can cause permanent damage.

Uveitis can be triggered by things like infections, eye injuries, or even an overactive immune response. Some breeds, like Appaloosas, Warmbloods, and Draught breeds, including Irish Draughts, are more likely to develop it.



### Tips Which May Help with Prevention:

- ✓ **Protect their eyes from UV & flies:** Use UV fly masks and repellents regularly
- ✓ **Keep up with vaccines and deworming:** A healthy horse is better able to fight off triggers
- ✓ **Act fast with eye issues:** Any eye injury or unusual symptoms should be checked by a vet right away
- ✓ **Keep an eye on at-risk horses:** If your horse has had uveitis before, watch for early signs of another flare-up

### Common Signs to Watch For:

- ✓ Squinting or keeping the eye partly closed
- ✓ Watery or teary eyes
- ✓ A cloudy or bluish look to the eye
- ✓ Redness around the eye
- ✓ Sensitivity to light
- ✓ A smaller-than-normal pupil

If you notice anything unusual with your horse's eyes, don't wait - call us right away! Early treatment can make a big difference in keeping your horse comfortable and protecting their vision.


